## Mander Organs (2006)

The organ at St Peter's is a three-manual mechanical (tracker) action instrument with 39 stops. The Great Organ is in the front of the case with the Choir Organ behind it and the Swell Organ at the rear. The swell box has an additional set of shutters facing west which the organist can choose to link to the swell pedal to improve the egress of the sound to the nave.
